#### Université Paris 1 Panthéon-Sorbonne...

- Re-funded in 1971 (consequence of the French May!)
- 3 main families of subjects : Economics and Management / Law and Political Science / Humanities
- 40 000 students
- 1000 teachers et researchers
- 1200 technical and administrative staff

#### Libraries in Université Paris 1:

- The Central University Library
- Cujas Inter-university Library
- Sorbonne Inter-university Library
- 40 smaller specialized libraries and documentation centres

Public Procurement in France

#### Public Procurement in France

- Public Procurement = contract between a public entity and a private company to procure works, goods or services
- 3 principles :
  - Free Access: any company can apply
  - Equal Treatment : the same information must be given to every candidate
  - Transparency of the procedure : the final decision must be based on objective criteria

## Main procedure : public invitation to tender

- Technical requirement produced by the public entity
- Notice of a competitive public tender
- Companies have 2 months to download the file and send a proposal
- Analysis of the bids
- Allocation of purchase orders to one candidate for a maximum period of four years

## Public procurement for digital collections...

- Two historic providers : subscription agencies Swets and Ebsco
- Few booksellers
- Expected services: good deal of knowledge of digital publishing and its technical specificities; intermediary between publishers and librarians; reactivity
- Foreign companies can participate!

**Budgetary Situation in French Universities** 

## The French law on the freedoms and responsibilities of universities (LRU)

- Act of 10 August 2007. Universities gradually :
  - Get budgetary autonomy
  - Manage directly their human resources
  - Own their property
- But the State's withdrawal leads to a financial crisis among French universities

#### Budgetary context in France

- Increased payroll
- Decreased spending on teaching, research... and libraries!
- National survey among 100 universities (October 2012):
  - maintained investment in library in 2013:35%
  - reduced investment in library in 2013: 62%
  - average drop announced : -9%

## Budgetary context in Paris 1

- A university in debt since 2011
- Teachers decreasingly hired
- Investment budgets heavily reduced (property, computer infrastructure, etc)
- ... but investment in libraries has been maintained in 2012, 2013 and 2014 (for how long?...)

## To purchase what?

Acquisition policy and selection criteria

#### Library policy decisions (2008-2012)

- Adjustment variable n°1: print documentation
- Adjustment variable n°2: documentation for students
- Consequence: provision of books for students heavily reduced between 2008 and 2012, cancellation of print journals

## Library policy decisions since 2012

- New adjustment variable: ill-used and nonbundled digital subscriptions
- Coming soon: cancellation of package deals and return to individual journals
- Consequence: end of non-bundled journals, end of ill-used electronic databases, unwillingness to any new subscription

#### Selection criteria (1)

- Content
  - General-interest or student-oriented resources
  - French-speaking resources
- Business model
  - Purchase rather than subscriptions
  - Ill-used products replaced by new products equal in price
  - Title-by-title purchase (no more bundling!)
  - No platform fees

## Selection criteria (2)

- Access
  - Remote access mandatory
  - Unlimited simultaneous access
  - No DRM for e-books
  - Usage reports mandatory
- Coming soon: resource mentioned in the knowledge base of our discovery tool

#### Decision-making process

- February to March
  - Collection and analysis of usage reports
- March to June
  - Trials on new products and evaluation through online surveys
- September
  - Requests for quotations
- September to October
  - Meetings with the acquisitions team
- November
  - Next year's budget preparation
- December
  - Decision of next year's subscriptions

#### Support of Open Access

- Subscription to Open Edition Freemium, from the Centre for Open Electronic Publishing (Cleo)
- Support of the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ)
- Participation to a national working group for Open access
- Information and education of our reseachers and doctoral students

#### Enhancement of electronic resources

- Access provided on the Domino portal : http://domino.univ-paris1.fr
- OpenURL link resolveur
- Cataloging of ebooks into the library's catalog
- Coming soon: purchase of a discovery tool

# Towards a national policy for STI

Digital Scientific Library (BSN)

## Digital Scientific Library

- Research infrastructure led by French Ministry for Higher Education and Research
- Coordination of projects relating to scientific and technic information (STI)
- 9 working groups among which: acquisitions, access, open archives

## ISTEX project

- Program of acquisitions of scientific resources
- Purchase of retrospective datas (backfiles, databases, corpus of texts ) in all subjects
- National licence agreement: resources should be remotely accessed by all members of higher education and research institutions.

#### Two national entities

- Couperin (University Consortium of Digital Publications):
  - a network uniting universities and research institutions (210 members)
  - evaluates, negotiates and arranges the purchase of electronic library resources
- ABES (Bibliographic Agency for Higher Education):
  - publicly-owned body within the French Ministry for Higher Education and Research
  - purchases digital resources negociated by Couperin

#### Implementation

- National survey among researchers (fall 2012)
- Call for tender: publishers send proposals
- First selection of resources
- National trial on the selected resources
- Negotiations
- Purchase of the resources through a national agreement
- Coming soon : hosting platform for the datas

#### Financial Means

- 60 million Euros of public funding to spend over 3 years (2014-2016)
  - 55 million to purchase the collections
  - 5 million to create a platform for the datas

#### Collections already purchased

- Backfiles journals and online encyclopaedias
- In humanities:
  - Brill backfiles (220 journals)
  - Early English Books Online (Proquest)
  - Eighteenth Century Collections Online (Gale)
  - Dictionaries and grammar books (Garnier)
  - New Pauly Online (Brill)
- Coming soon: 2<sup>nd</sup> selection, based on corpus of texts and ebooks

#### In conclusion...

- Libraries have widely switched from print to digital collections
- But now budgetary issues and business models paralyze acquisition policies
- To really do their job, librarians want flexibility and freedom of choice back!
